## GENERAL INFORMATION FOR STAFF AND STUDENTS

### BACKGROUND

The competition has been organised by the Komiti Faafoe. This is to encourage Samoan students to participate in public speaking and to provide an opportunity to use their mother tongue.

### ELIGIBILITY

This competition is open to all full-time Secondary School Samoan Students. Adult students are not eligible for entry.

### SPEECH FORMS

This must be a prepared speech. The salutation or introduction may be as formal as is appropriate for the speaker.

### PRESENTATION

The Student may dress in a manner, appropriate for their speech (formal, ethnic wear or school uniform).

### SPEECH MEDIUM

The Speech or Talk must be in the Samoan language (**it is not oratory/lauga**).

### AWARDS

At the end of the day, placing for each Speech category will be given. All participants will receive a Certificate while a Certificate of Merit will be awarded to first, second and third

placing in all sections. A Certificate of Merit will also be awarded to first, second and third placing in the 'Impromptu Speech' section.

The student who is awarded first place at each Year Level and the Impromptu Section will be representing Auckland at the National Samoan Speech Competition this year.

## COMPETITION SCHEDULE

Year 9, 10 and 11 will take place on Wednesday, 14 March 2012, from 12.30 pm. Year 12, 13 and the Impromptu section will take place on Thursday, 15 March 2012 from 9.00am.

## SPEECH TOPICS

Years 9 & 10 will choose **ONE** topic from the list below:

**Topic 1:**        **O la'u aganu'u e iloa ai a'u.**  
My Culture defines me

**Topic 2:**        **O sao tāua o le tauvaga lakapi a le lalolagi i tupulaga Samoa**  
The impact of the 2011 Rugby World Cup on Samoan youth

Years 11, 12 & 13 will choose **ONE** topic from the list below:

**Topic 1**        **O le a le uiga o le Taulaga malosi ma Ta'uta'ua ia te a'u le tagata Samoa?**  
What does the Supercity mean for me as a Samoan?

**Topic 2**        **E faapefea ona momoli mai e le Ofisa o Matagaluega o Fuainumera ma Faamaumauga i tagata Samoa faamatalaga e faaleleia atiliai a latou fa'ai'uga?**

How does NZ Statistics provide information for Samoan people to improve outcomes?

## Impromptu:

Open to all year levels, but students entered for this category must **not** compete in the other categories, and **one** entry per school.

## TAUVAGA TAUTALAGA 2012

### SAMOAN SPEECH SPECIFIC RULES 2012

#### SPECIFIC RULES

1. Speech must be on the topic given in the entry form
2. Students must be of Samoan heritage
3. The speech must be original and must be a prepared speech. The salutation and introduction must be as formal as is appropriate for the speaker.
4. The speech must be in Samoan
5. Speeches must be memorized. **CUE CARDS ARE NOT ALLOWED**
6. A student must be entered in ONE category only, either in Y9, Y10, Y11, Y12 or Y13.  
The entry must be for ONE topic only
7. YEAR 9  
Minimum of 1 minute  
Maximum of 3 minutes  
YEAR 10  
Minimum of 2 minutes  
Maximum of 4 minutes  
YEAR 11-13  
Minimum of 3 minutes  
Maximum of 5 minutes
8. For the 'Impromptu Section', only ONE ENTRY per school will be allowed. To be eligible for this section, the student must not have entered in the above categories.  
Minimum of 3 minutes  
Maximum of 5 minutes
9. Time Flags will be used to indicate when time limits are reached.

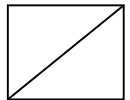

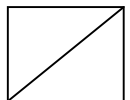

#### TAGA VAAIA (Body language) Taga'i i le

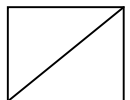
- ❖ Taga o lima / faaogaina o lima (gestures)

#### FAASOLOGA O VAEGA O LE TAUTALAGA (Structure)

##### AANO O LE TAUTALAGA - Taga'i i le:

- ❖ Upu tomua / folasaga (introduction)
- ❖ Aano o le tautalaga (Body - explained clearly)
- ❖ Mau e lagolagoina ai manatu ( supporting evidence e.g. stats, quotes)
- ❖ Sologa lelei o manatu (Logical order)
- ❖ Faaiuga / Aotelega o Manatu (conclusion)
- ❖ Talafeagai ma le au faafofoga (Relevance)
- ❖ Fa'aaogaina o upu talafeagai (Use of language features eg rhetorical, repetition, figurative/ emotive language)
- ❖ Se aoga po'o aafiaga (impact)
- ❖ Iloa ona faafiafia le au faafofoga (entertaining)
- ❖ Originality - impact, thought provoking and entertaining.
